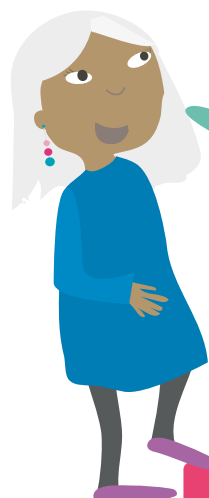
HOW TO USE THIS LOG BOOK

This is your log book. It's where you'll keep a record of all the things you've done using your chosen Out of the Ark songs from Sparkyard. By working your way through the different sections, you'll have the chance to take part in exciting arts activities, find out more about artists and share everything you've learned.



WHAT IS ARTS AWARD?

Arts Award supports young people to develop as artists and arts leaders, offering the opportunity to develop creative and leadership skills and get those skills recognised through national qualifications. Arts Award is offered at 5 levels:



Sometimes Arts Award can be part of a themed project or activity. You can work towards a number of Arts Awards over a period of time if you wish or, after finishing Discover, take the next step to Arts Award Explore.

To achieve an Arts Award Discover certificate using Sparkyard, you need to collect evidence in this log book.

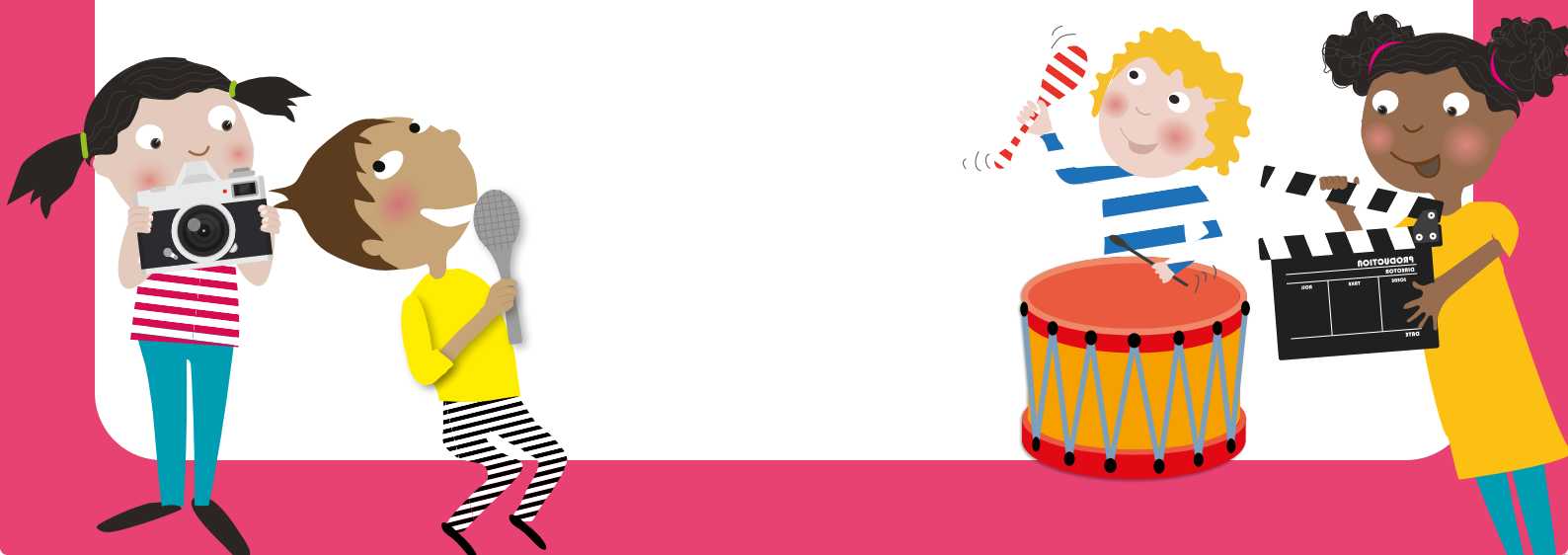

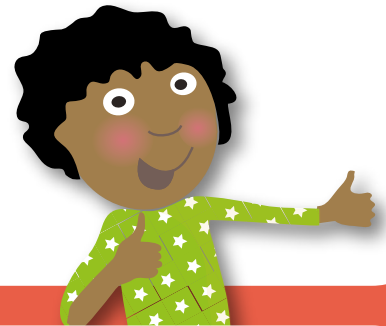
