## Train as an Arts Award Adviser

Arts Award helps schools by giving them the freedom to deliver an accredited arts qualification in a flexible way, aided by free resources, support and feedback from the Trinity team.

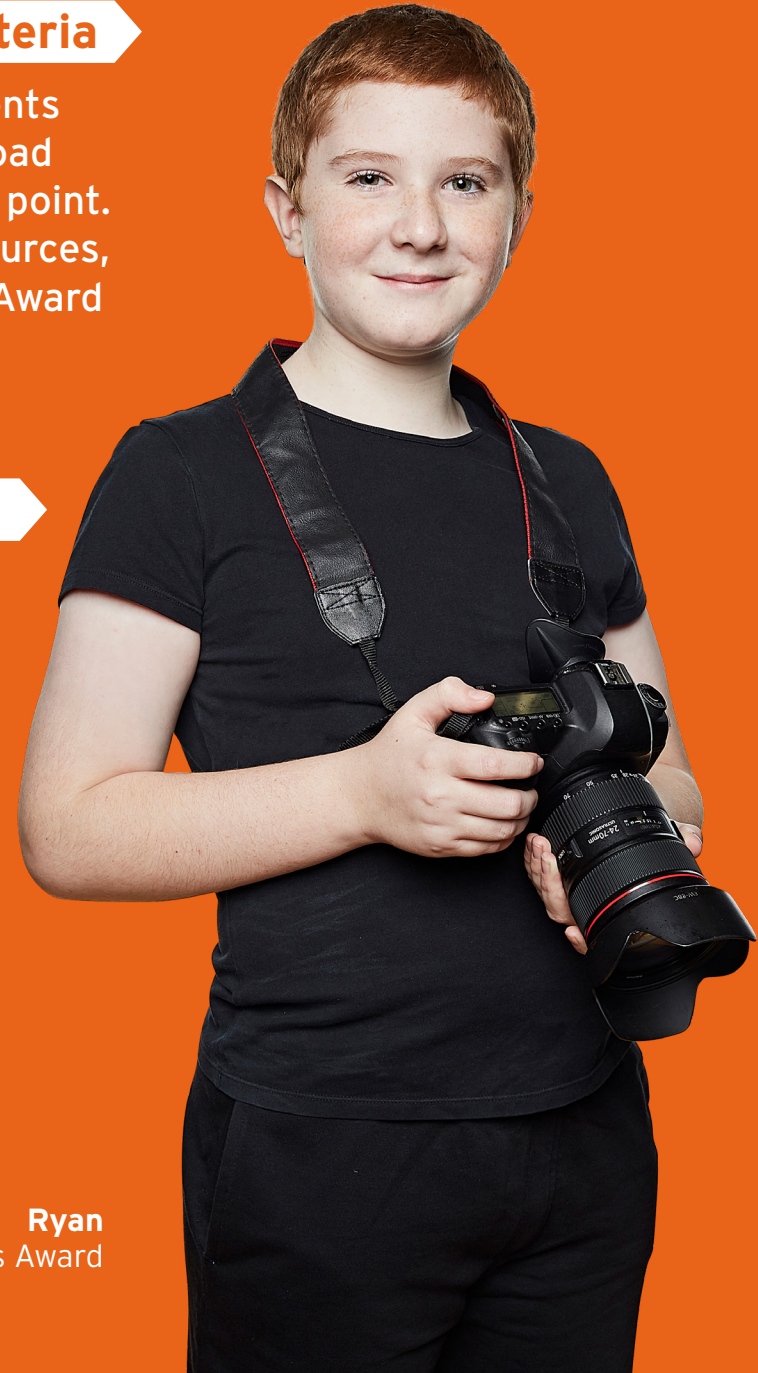

# STEP 3 ASSESS



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## Assess students' portfolios

### Book your assessment

Book your moderation date online, making sure to do so 8 weeks in advance. We have a range of moderation options, from in-house to joint to postal and online.

### Assess your portfolios

Using your toolkit, carefully mark your portfolios against the Arts Award criteria. Get support from Trinity College London prior to your moderation to ensure evidence is present and you are prepared for the big day.

### Plan your moderation

On the day of moderation, one of our moderators will assess your marking, and confirm if the young people have passed. You will receive provisional results on the day, with certificates following 4-6 weeks later.
